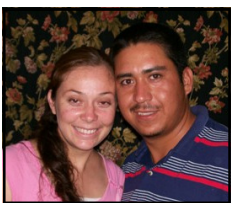

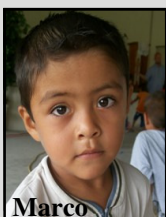

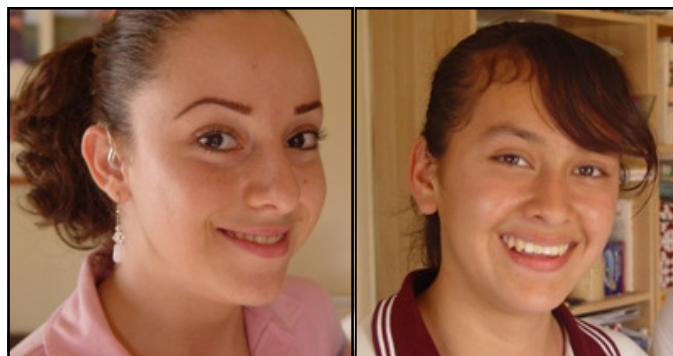
November has been a great month and we are running full speed into December. Thank you for your prayers and support. You are a blessing to us. May the Lord be with you, and you with Him.
